As an example: A birth record was found for "John Smith" born in 1801 to Jim Smith and Mary Doe (both born in 1775), but there was no marriage or death records found for John. Later, we find a birth record for "Jimmy Smith" born in 1830 to parents "John Smith (age 30) and Sue Black (age 28). We note that we just discovered two "John Smiths" which have similar birth years, so it is possible they are the same person. There is no guarantee they are the same, so this family unit is marked as inferred. This suggests that we found the wife of our original John Smith, so Sue Black is paired with him (we do know that the couple "John and Sue" exists; we are just not exactly sure if they connect to Jim and Mary.
